President's Report:

- Check received, and assessment paid for unit 71

Block Watch Report:

Landscape Report:

- Edging hasn't been completed since using new vendors.
- Crew members with the landscape service has cited a need for another body on the team to accomplish the work. Julie Pock to follow
- Irrigation status for property is currently in flex. Waiting to hear an eta.
- Blackberry shrub near unit 54 needs to be trimmed.

Old Business:

- We are moving forward with MasterVac for storm drain repair. Their bid was the most comprehensive at a reasonable cost.
- The special assessment is already 40% funded! Hooray!
- Garage roof moss removal process has been approved, but still needs to be scheduled.

New Business:

- Spot control and building permitted treatments for pest control was completed.
- The board is considering feral cats as a form of pest control through RASK to contain rodent issues.
 - Feral cats are only an option if bait stations are removed, per king county code.
 - A forum will be had on July 9th to address concerns regarding the feral cats. Forum will be hosted by Pam Wells.
